### 2022 High School Graduates:

Eligible applicants must: submit an application by Sunday, June 5<sup>th</sup> at midnight, be a 2022 High School graduate, be an active member of St John Baptist Church for a minimum of one year\*, submit a copy of the acceptance letter from their higher education institution of your choice (acceptable institutions include: two or four year colleges/universities, trade schools, and technical colleges), and must submit a typed essay between 1000 and 1500 words (prompts found on page 3).

### Recurring College Students:

Eligible applicants must: submit an application by Sunday, June 5<sup>th</sup> at midnight, be continuing in undergraduate education, be an active member of St John Baptist Church for a minimum of one year\*, submit a copy of your transcript (official or unofficial), verification of enrollment for Fall 2022, and must submit a typed essay between 1000 and 1500 words (prompts found on page 3).
